Australia-ASEAN Youth Summits: Students Unveil Youth Declaration at Parliament House

Canberra - August 19, 2024 – The 2024 Australia-ASEAN Youth Summit took place at Parliament House in Canberra on Monday.

Facilitated by Asia Education Foundation (AEF), the event brought together over 120 high school students from across Australia and nine countries in Southeast Asia. Participation was hybrid, with 24 students attending in person and 100 joining virtually, highlighting the AEF's commitment to connecting young leaders across the region.

The Summit followed two virtual sessions held on June 18 and July 25 during which students engaged in in-depth discussions about regional cooperation between Australia and Southeast Asia. Students then collaborated to create a Youth Declaration with recommendations on six Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including quality education, gender equity and climate action.

In the Declaration, students called on leaders to urgently address issues of education inequality, gender discrimination, renewable energy transition, social and economic inequalities, sustainable urban development, and climate change mitigation. Their declaration reflects the passion and urgency of youth voices calling for bold, transformative action.

At the Canberra Summit, students presented their Youth Declaration to Australian Government Ministers, Members of Parliament and representatives from Southeast Asian nations. They enjoyed addresses from The Hon Tim Watts MP, Assistant Minister for Foreign Affairs and The Hon Dr Anne Aly MP, Minister for Youth. Students were also able to meet distinguished guests, including The Hon Jason Clare MP, Minister for Education and Senator the Hon Penny Wong, Minister for Foreign Affairs.

The Australia-ASEAN Youth Summits are funded by the ASEAN-Australia Centre (formerly Australia-ASEAN Council) at the Australian Government Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and implemented by Asia Education Foundation, part of Asialink at the University of Melbourne.
